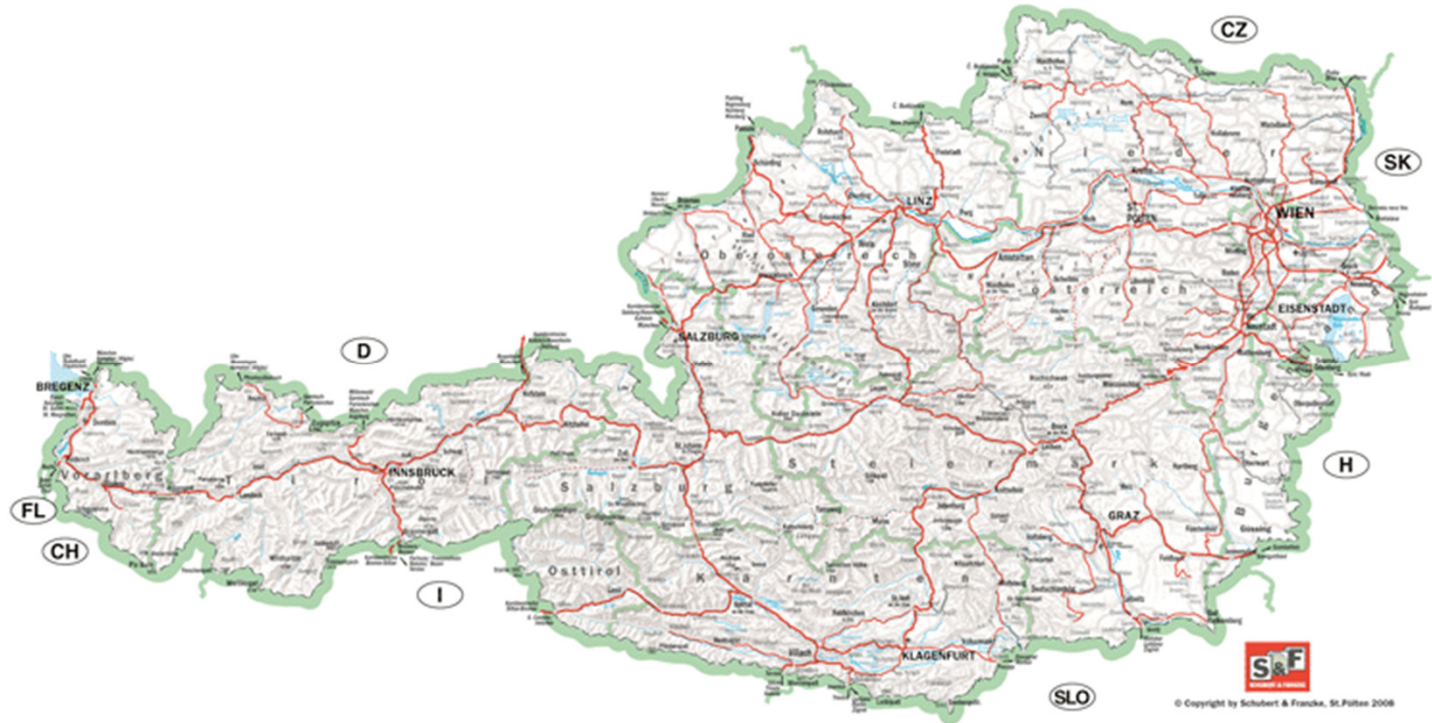

2011: 14.416

2012: 17.413 (+ 20,79 %) –

12.846 male, 4.567 female

# Steps to asylum 1

## **Arrival at the initial reception center**

fingerprints

1st interview about travel route at the federal  
asylum agency

## **RESULT**

Positive: asylum procedure

Negative: back to country, first country in Europa  
appeal possible: the Asylum Court

# Steps to asylum 2

- Asylum procedure

2nd interview about reasons for fleeing the home country

## RESULT:

Positive 1: Asylum in Austria

Positive 2: subsidiary protection

Negative: No permission to stay

appeal possible at Asylum Court

if negative again: appeal at constitutional court

# During asylum procedure

- 5,- Euro per day for food
- Health insurance
- Accomodation provided by state
- Private accomodation 240,- Euro each family
- 40,- Euro „pocket money“
- 150,- Euro per year for clothes
- 200,- Euro per student for school expenses

# During asylum procedure

- No working permission
- No right to access to language classes
- No choice where to stay
